SHOPPING CENTRES - A WORD OF CAUTION TO PARENTS:

We are aware of the practice of dropping children off at the different big shopping centres where they are left free to entertain themselves. We bring to parents' attention the following for careful consideration:

FOUNDATION PHASE CHESS:




