

English	Revise `C` for Clever Cat:	
	Learners to give words that start with `c`	
	Practice writing `c` in the air using their pointy finger.	
	Learners to draw a picture of what they miss about school. Encourage the	
	learners to draw using pencils. Discuss the picture with them and write a	
	sentence at the bottom.	
	Sing the letter land song of clever cat.	
<u>Life Skills</u>	Gross Motor Skills: Keeping fit and strong:	
	Jump with your leg and arms out x5 and swap your leg. Stretch up and move	
	your arms to the left and right like a tree being blown by the wind.	
	Throw and catch a small ball, throw and catch a big ball.

<u>Maths</u>	Counting:	
	Learners to count as far as they can using sticks, stones, pasta.	
	Do story sums of adding things together, subtracting things.	
	Shapes: Discuss shapes around us:	
	What shape is your mom`s phone?	
	What shape is the bathroom mirror?	
	What shape is a frying pan?	
	 What shape is a tomato? What shape is your favourite toy? 	
English	Read the story:	
	The very hungry caterpillar by Eric Carle.

	After reading the story make your own hungry caterpillar:	
	Cut an egg crate	
	 Paint the head red and rest of the body green

	Wednesday 27 th May 2020		
	Morning Ring: What's the weather, what's the weather, what's the weather like today, tell us (child's name) what's the weather, what's the weather like today? Is it sunny, is it cloudy, is it raining out today, is it snowy, is it windy, what's the weather like today? What is the first month of a year? What month are we in?		
<u>Maths</u>	Count backwards using the nursery rhyme 5 little ducks ``Five little ducks went out one day, over the hills and far away, Mother duck called, `quack, quack, quack, quack,!`` But only four little ducks came back,,,,, Story sums: John has three slices of bread, he eats two how many are left? Buhle has four chocolates, she gives one to her mom, one to her brother and one to her dad. How many chocolates is she left with?		
English	Visual Memory: Ask the learners to find objects around the home that begin with "c" for clever cat such as, comb, cup, crayon, cap, cube, clip, can. Then hide the objects and ask them to remember what the objects are. Bring the objects out one at a time in a particular order and ask them to remember what the order was. Start with two objects and increase the number depending on how many they can remember. Rotate the game and let the child be in charge also. Acknowledge their hard work of trying to memories the objects and praise them		
Life Skills	 Encourage them if they are finding the activity hard by using less objects. Discuss the importance of washing hands. Encourage learners to: Wash/Sanitize their hands regularly Tidy up your toys after play Make your own bed

Friday 29 th May 2020		
	Morning Ring: Today's date and weather	
<u>Maths</u>	 Counting; Count the pegs as far as you can Sort out your coloured pencils and place them according to colour. How many colours are there? How many pencils are long? How many pencils are short? Which one is your favourite colour? 	
<u>English</u>	Read your favourite story and discuss your favourite part. Retell the story to your mom and dad Are there any words that begin with `c` for clever cat?	
Life Skills	Making hedgehogs: What you need: Paper Black koki or permanent maker Brown wax crayon/oil pastel/twisty Scissors Stapler	
	 Method: Draw a black circle in the middle of your paper plate using black koki or permanent marker and colour it in. This will be the hedgehogs nose. Draw two eyes above it. Around the edge of the paper plate draw another black circle. This line will help you know where to stop when you cut. Cut a slit from the bottom of the plate, right up the middle and stop in the middle of his nose. Fold the paper over itself to make a cone and ask an adult to staple it for you. Using the scissors, cut thin slits from the edge of paper plate and stop at the black line. Do this around the whole plate. 	

- Bend the spikes up.
- Add some detail to the eyes if you want.
- Give your hedgehog a name.
