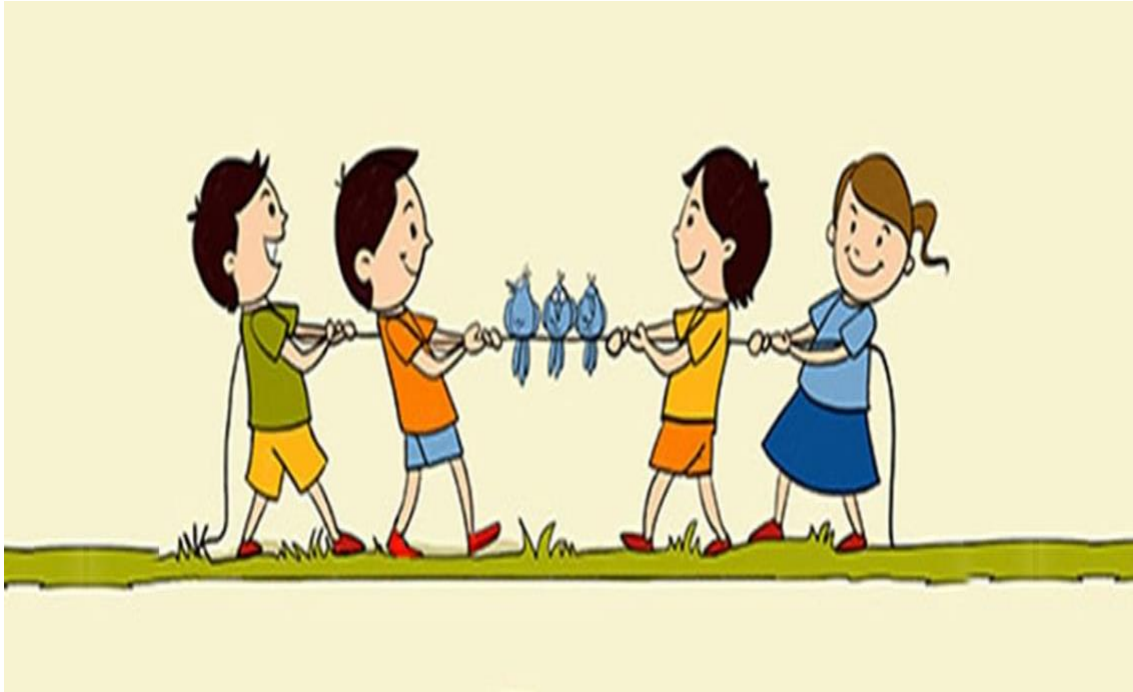

Monday 15th June 2020

<p><u>Maths</u></p>	<p>Morning Ring: Today`s date and weather. What day is it today? What day was yesterday? What day is it tomorrow? What day comes after Sunday? How many months are there in a year? What month is your birthday? What date is your birthday? The children must sing their days of the week and months of the year songs DAILY.</p> <p>Daily counting. Count everyday objects. How many ears/ toes/ eyes/ fingers does a person have?</p> <p>Revising number 7: Clap 7 times loudly. Clap 7 times softly. Hop 7 times on your left leg then hop another 7 times on your right leg.</p> <p>Complete page 9 in the Introduction to Numbers workbook.</p>
<p><u>English</u></p>	<p>Use flash cards to revise all the sight words done thus far.</p> <p>Ask your child to draw a picture of their weekend news. Please write a sentence for them under their picture.</p>
<p><u>Life Skills</u></p>	<p>Ask the children if they understand what social distancing is. Show them how far apart we need to stand from other people. Please explain to them that this will not be forever just for now so we can help flatten the curve. Practice the distance of how far apart we should be with your child a few times.</p>

- Put 6 fingers and 1 finger together. How many are there?

Introducing Oscar orange.

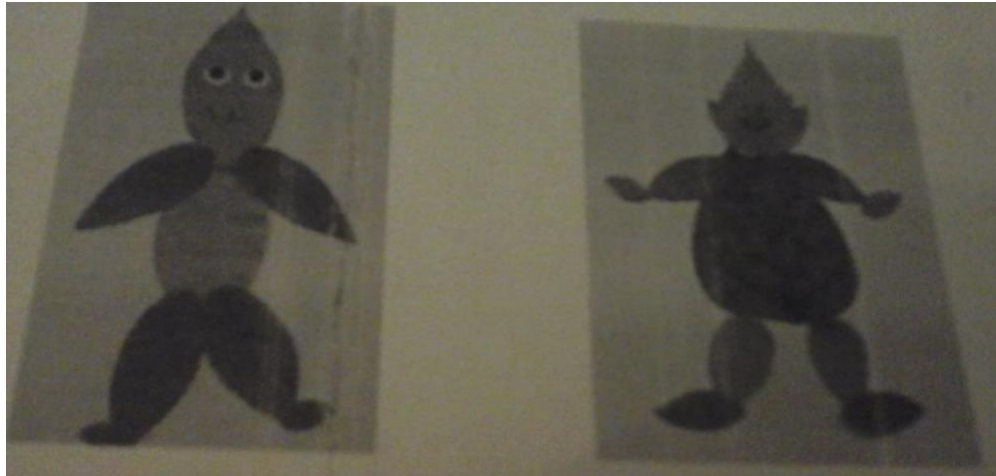
Learn the words of the Oscar orange song.

Life Skills

Make a leaf man.



Use the back of a cereal box or a cardboard to stick the leaves on.
Go outside and pick up a few different leaves of different shapes, colours and sizes.

- Plan and arrange the leaves on your piece of board to make your leaf man.
- Use your glue to stick the leaves in position.
- Add details such as eyes, mouth, nose and hair.
- Draw extra features around your leaf man like the sky, grass, the weather, etc.

Wednesday 17th June 2020

<p><u>Maths</u></p>	<p>Morning Ring: Today`s date and weather. What day is it today? What day was yesterday? What day is it tomorrow? How many days in a week? How many months are there in a year? The children must sing their days of the week and months of the year songs DAILY.</p> <p>Daily counting. Count backwards using the nursery rhyme 7 little ducks `7 little ducks went out one day, over the hills and far away, Mother duck called, `quack, quack, quack, quack,!` But only four little ducks came back...</p> <p>Story sums: Jabu has 4 sweets and Mikey gives him 2 more sweets, how many sweets does Jabu have now? Mia has 6 cupcakes she gives 3 cupcakes to her friends, how many cupcakes does she have left? Please make up more story sums as you go along.</p>
<p><u>English</u></p>	<p>Sing the Oscar orange song.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Can you think of some words that begin with ‘o’?• What sea animal begins with the ‘o’ sound?• What fruit begins with ‘o’?• What shape begins with ‘o’? <p>Complete the activity on page 7 in the Introduction to Writing workbook.</p>
<p><u>Life Skills</u></p>	<p>Put a ball between your legs and walk like a penguin. Jog in a circle 5 times and then walk backwards once in a circle. March on the spot like a soldier. Count up to 10 as you march.</p>

Life Skills

Place a rope or sticks 1.5 meters apart. (To help familiarise the child with distance.)

Stretch your body out on the floor next to the rope / sticks to see how tall you are.

Lay on your back and breathe in for the count of 3, hold your breath for the count of 5 and breathe out to the count on 10. Repeat 3 times.
